Open Discussion

Another point that was brought up during the last board
meeting was attendance and how to reinvigorate the
club.

At the board meeting the 3-2-1 was discussed and the
idea was brought up to experiment with this format for

the RNK during this summer, to see if it could help engage membership and see an increase in activity.

The 3-2-1 format has been adopted by other Kiwanis Club, typically newer clubs; and is consists of each of the following objectives in a given month:

- 3 Hours of service
- 2 Hours of socializing
- 1 Hour business meeting

Some of the initial discussion at the board meeting debated the necessity of giving each individual pillar focus or combining them

Brian made the argument that if we're going to try this format, that we should do it by the numbers and not cut corners; in order to judge its full effectiveness

Brian added, "While I get the idea that when we work events, we have a good time working alongside each other; I don't know about anyone else, but I'm not exactly relaxed when putting on event; especially one I've helped plan. That comes when we've packed up and I'm heading home."

Brian went on to suggest that instead of asking members to schedule a speaker, they could each take turns to plan a single social opportunity for the club; which could range from something more in-depth, like members attending an "escape room" or getting together for a game night.

Other members generally agreed with the idea of keeping the social meetings separate from the service projects and giving each its own focus.

One idea brought up was to keep one regular noon meeting each month as strictly a lunch meeting with no program, which would serve, in part, as part of the socializing time for that month.

Amanda suggested starting the trial format in June; and asked Brian to try and reschedule the planned visit by the Girl Scouts; and look at doing a clean-up of Kiwanis Park and the trail sometime during the first week of June. Details for that service project could be planned during an open discussion in May.

Additional projects already scheduled, that would serve as our monthly project times:

July - Brat fry on the Village Green during a summer concert

August - Doug Lyke Run

September – Septemberfest Pancake Breakfast
